### Legislation/Regulations Affecting Veterinary Practices: Ohio House Bill 267

Ohio HB 267 affects all health professionals licensed to prescribe drugs, requires them to enroll in this new program, and to use the newly created official prescription form. As currently proposed, HB 267 includes veterinarians. You would be required to pay a \$250 annual fee to enroll in the program and obtain the new secure prescription pads. OVMA opposes the bill. ## CVMA Finance Committee Report

The CVMA Finance Committee met on Tuesday February 16th. Dr. Bo Williamson, Dr. Gretchen Goode and Dr. Jack Walkenhorst were in attendance.

We are projecting a modest increase in *revenue* this year due to:

1. An increase in membership and an increase in dues from \$100 to \$125
2. A projected increase in the Fall Short Course attendance
3. An anticipated increase in CE sponsorships.
4. Anticipated increase in gains from our investment accounts at Merrill-Lynch

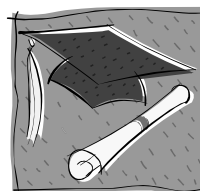
Our expenses are, for the most part, fixed, but we do anticipate a few changes:

1. Our website expenses will decrease due to increased management by the CVMA
2. Our professional service expenses (accountant) will decrease due to a change in accountants
3. Our monthly CE expenses are projected to increase
4. We again are recommending that we not fund the OSU scholarships but continue to fund the technician scholarships.

The overall financial position and outlook for the CVMA is very sound. We are projecting a modest net operating surplus for 2010.

### Spotlight Animal Welfare Group: *United Coalition for Animals (UCAN)*



UCAN's goals are stated in much simpler terms than all the effort that it takes many people to strive to achieve them. **Imagine** a world without euthanasia. **Reduce pet overpopulation** by providing effective, safe, affordable neuters and spay options. **Educate** people about the importance of spaying and neutering pets. **Change minds and attitudes.** The most important catch phrase of UCAN: **FIX YOUR PET.** Established in 2001, UCAN opened the first non-profit spay/neuter clinic in Queensgate in 2007. Since then, over 21,000 animals have been altered. Recently, UCAN, in conjunction with the Cincinnati Freestore Foodbank received a \$30,000 grant to fund an innovative new program, "Pets in Need", a program that will benefit Cincinnati's poorest families who qualify by providing basic veterinary care for their pets. The animals that will benefit are pets and/or strays that would likely not receive traditional veterinary care if UCAN's program wasn't available. This program is not intended to compete with private veterinary hospital's services; rather, its goal is to help take some of the pressure off these facilities that often are expected to provide lower than cost veterinary care to stray animals at their own expense. The program also includes a Continued Care Fund which can be used to refer pets requiring more extensive care by local vets who register to accept referrals from Pets in Need. UCAN also plans to hold approximately 20 wellness clinics this year, with several of the events being staffed by a veterinarian and veterinary technician students from the Raymond Walters College of Veterinary Technology as part of their required hands-on-training. ### CVMA Member to Receive AAHA's Commitment to Excellence Award, March 2010

The VCA Tennessee Avenue Animal Hospital will receive the prestigious *Commitment to Excellence Award* at the 76<sup>th</sup> annual meeting of the American Animal Hospital Association (AAHA) in Long Beach, California on Saturday, March 20, 2010.

The VCA Tennessee Avenue Animal Hospital, formerly the Theobald Animal Hospital, is located at 1381 Tennessee Ave., in Bond Hill. It is one of three small animal hospitals nationally which have been AAHA Accredited members for 75 consecutive years.

This honor represents longstanding adherence to the high quality standards of the American Animal Hospital Association and maintaining the status as an accredited member of AAHA. The original owner of the hospital was Dr. Arthur Theobald, Sr. one of the three founding members of the AAHA. The first annual meeting was held in 1935 at the Netherland Hotel, and approximately 20 veterinarians attended.

Since that time, the AAHA has evolved into an international organization of over 6,000 veterinary care teams, comprised of more than 42,000 veterinary professionals. AAHA is the only organization that accredits veterinary practices throughout the U.S. and Canada for dedication to high standards of veterinary care. ### Passages: Thomas Clarke, III

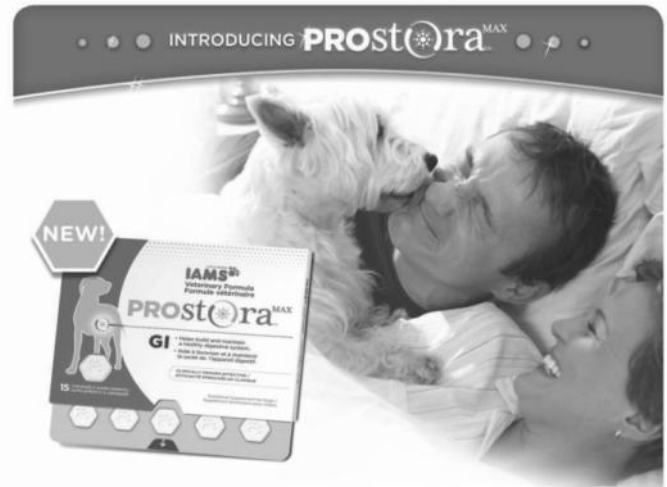
Dr. Thomas John Clarke III, 72, of Cincinnati, OH, passed away on Saturday, February 13, 2010. Dr. Clarke received his Doctor of Veterinary Medicine degree from Ohio State University ('62). He was awarded a prestigious Angell Memorial Animal Hospital internship in Boston, MA ('63).



He was a veterinarian for 43 years with an animal hospital in Kenwood and clinics in Milford and Wyoming. During his illustrious career, Thomas received numerous honors and served as Director of the American Animal Hospital Association, Cincinnati Veterinary Medical Association and Ohio Veterinary Medical Association. Thomas acted as an Ohio State University Practitioner Lecturer for 11 years and was a lifetime member of the American Animal Hospital Association. He represented Veterinary Medicine for the U.S. State Department in Germany, Denmark, England, Ireland, Scotland, Australia and New Zealand ('84-'86). The CVMA greatly appreciates the contributions of Dr. Clarke to the veterinary field and our organization. He will be missed.

### Practice Notes: Updated canine heartworm guidelines published, Feb. 19, 2010

The American Heartworm Society (AHS) released new canine heartworm guidelines for 2010. These guidelines are considered the official veterinary industry perspective for epidemiology, diagnosis and treatment of the disease and include some notable differences from previous versions. ## Ohio Veterinary Medical Licensing Board News: Filling & Dispensing Prescriptions:

In October 2009, the Ohio Veterinary Licensing Board considered the issue of who can handle the drugs in a veterinary office? Additionally, can a receptionist hand a prescription to a client that the veterinarian has filled previously, but is out to lunch when the client arrives? OVMLB Director Winsley specified that his answer applies to all prescription drugs. It does not apply to over-the-counter medications.

After reviewing pertinent sections of the law, the basic answer is as follows:

*The Veterinarian can assign someone (not necessarily an RVT) to pull out the drug, count it and label it. However, the veterinarian must do a final check of the finished product for verification purposes. There must be a mechanism in place to show that the veterinarian has "approved" the finished product. Section 4729.29 ORC permits the veterinarian to "personally furnish" a prescription drug. Therefore, the veterinarian MUST be on the premises when the prescription drug is furnished to a client.*

The CVMA Board, on behalf of its membership, will be sending a response objecting to this interpretation of the regulations. In addition, CVMA Board member Dave Merry has drafted a response letter to Director Winsley's interpretation that he is making available to others who would like to respond to the issue.
